Preface

The theme for Breast Cancer Awareness month 2021 is "RISE: Rally In Supporting, Serving and Screening Everyone," which encourages women to go for mammogram screening and raise breast cancer awareness with the support of their family and friends to overcome fear, anxiety, and uncertainty. There is a need for regular educational interventions and training programs on infection control practices for Breast Cancer across all people around the **VIGNANs INSTITUTE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY**.

Breast cancer is a quite scary feeling, and most women assume that it won't affect them. The National Breast Cancer Foundation reports that every ten minutes a woman is diagnosed with breast cancer across the globe. With early detection, a woman's survival rates go up and her quality of life improves. That's why breast self-exams are an essential way for women to give a fighting chance, especially during Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Early signs of breast cancer can be a small lump in a breast, a painful breast or armpit or a discharge from the nipple. Even if none of these symptoms shows themselves, an annual check-up and a mammogram examination should be taken to rule out any risk. A mammogram procedure is painless and takes about ten minutes.

Ruling out breast cancer early and getting cutting edge cancer treatments are the most crucial strategies to avert deaths from this debilitating carcinoma. Breast cancer that's detected early, when small and has not spread is easier to treat effectively. Getting regular screening tests is the most reliable method to find breast cancer at an early stage.

SYNOPSIS OF THE EVENT

- Create cancer awareness and remove the stigma and fear attached.
- Help people recognize the early signs and symptoms of cancer, thus enabling them to seek treatment at an early stage.
- Educate people about the key risk factors, since more than 30% of cancer cases could be prevented by modifying lifestyle or avoiding the risk factors.
- Inform people about the importance of regular screening and check-ups.
- Inform women about mammograms, clinical breast exam and breast self-exam.
- Inform women about Pap smear tests to check for signs of cervical cancer.
- The primary goal of ICS is to promote and develop awareness in the public and emphasize the importance of early detection, all of which play a major role in the treatment of cancer. Cancer awareness can also lead to people making healthier lifestyle choices.

About the event

On Oct 29, 2021, from 01:30 P.M. to 4:30 P.M., the women empowerment cell of VIIT hosted a awareness Programme on "**Breast cancer awareness**", considering it as a basic requirement to understand the basic implementation to avoid the disease with

minimal precautions. It helps us to examine our personal attitudes and beliefs and question the 'realities' that we thought we know.

The aim of the program is to create cancer awareness amongst the population of India. It is important to dispel the myths that people wrongly believe, inform them about the signs and symptoms, and importance of screening for early detection. It is also vital to follow a healthy lifestyle, and sharing of survivor stories gives a message of hope and confidence.

Majority (91%) participants of the ladies cancer awareness program was women and public (90%). Majority (66%) learned about program from the community. The findings showed positive and moderate relationships between

- short lecture and program effectiveness ($r = .625$, $P = 0.00$),
- sharing session with survivor ($r = .577$, $P = 0.00$),
- awareness exhibition ($r = .376$, $P = 0.00$),
- facilities program ($r = .246$, $P = 0.00$),
- health screening ($r = .192$, $P = 0.00$).
- Short lecture ($\beta = .773$; $P < .000$)
- showed a major contribution to cancer awareness program effectiveness

Objective of the event

1. Improving the availability and accessibility of screening services across Jordan, particularly to underprivileged and remote areas with little access to healthcare services;
2. Increasing the knowledge of the public on the benefits of early detection, changing attitudes and behaviors to seek early detection services, and raising awareness around breast cancer and cancer prevention in general;
3. Establishing national unified protocols and guidelines that cover all processes of a comprehensive early detection and screening program;
4. Developing collaborations and partnerships among different national, regional and international entities and stakeholders to maintain sustainability.
5. Improving the education and training of healthcare providers.
6. Monitoring and evaluating the implementation and progress of different JBCP work, and creating an enabling environment for availability of data for sound decision making around breast cancer early detection and screening.

Summary of the Awareness Programme

Being sensitive is, very simply put, being appreciative of others' feelings. In that context, gender sensitivity is about being considerate of the opposite gender's feelings. The reason this is important is because men and women think differently, and obviously, have varying perspectives.

The first and most important aspect of gender sensitivity is to be open to the perspective and feelings of any colleague of the opposite gender. This could be a simple case of knowing enough about their personal issues to more nuanced understanding of gender-specific aspects such as comments or jokes that could be offensive.

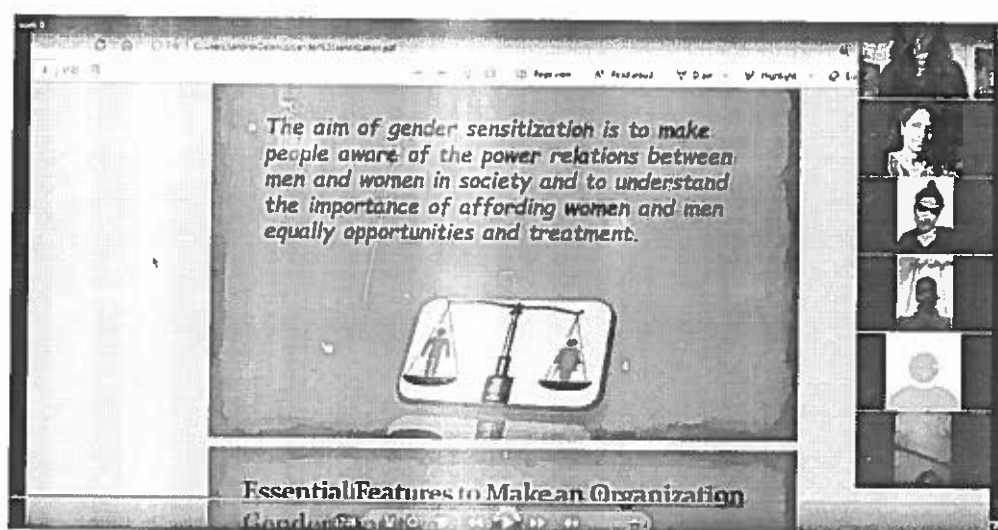
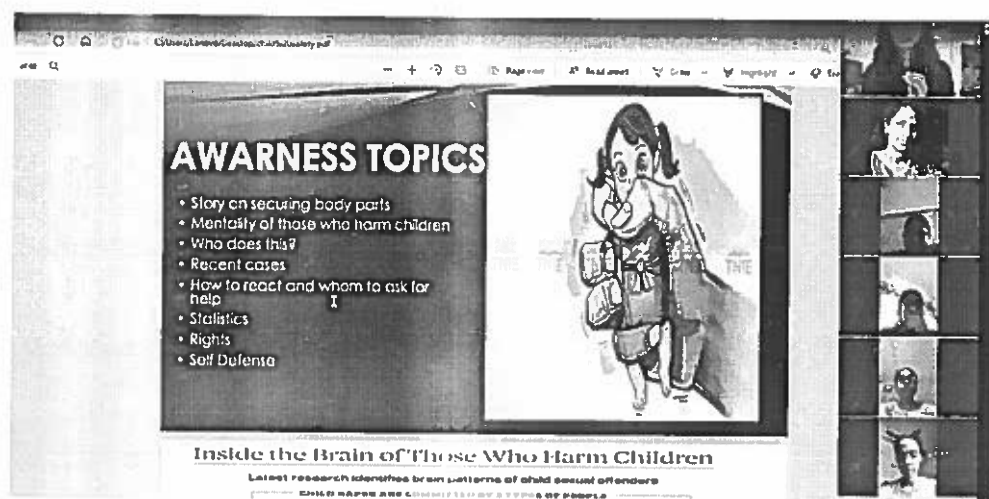
Although there is an increasing awareness about this topic, and organisations have started to define the limits of behaviour, the onus is still with an individual. Increasingly, men and women have started working together in managerial roles and unless there is a mutual sense of respect and comfort, teams will not be effective.

Discussions on essential features to make an organization gender-sensitive were being discussed considering gender equality as a Priority along with adequate resources as well as management staff relationships in the current scenario and decision-making access for women. Several myths and facts were discussed on sexual harassment and its ignorance, a display of power as a part of perpetrator and embarrassment aspects and sense of humour. In addition to this, the culture of silence was discussed with some suggestions.

Outcome of the awareness Programme

1. To make people aware of the power relations between men and women in the society.
2. To understand the importance of affording women and men equal opportunities as well as treatment.
3. A way to reduce barriers to personal and economic development created by sexism.
4. Gender sensitivity helps to generate respect for the individual regardless of sex.
5. Gender sensitivity is not about pitting women against men.

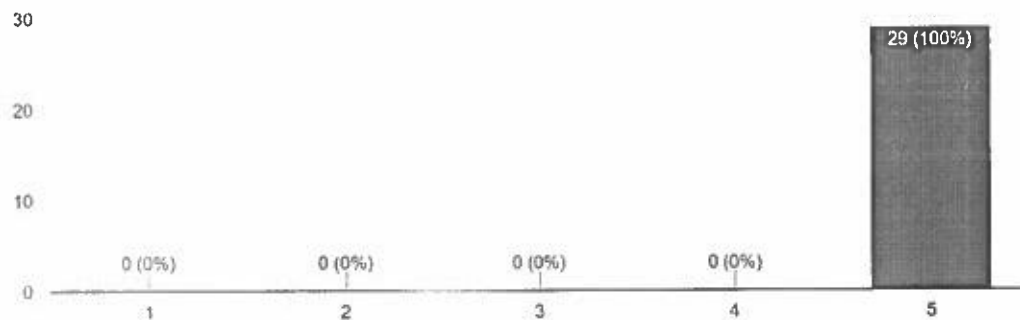

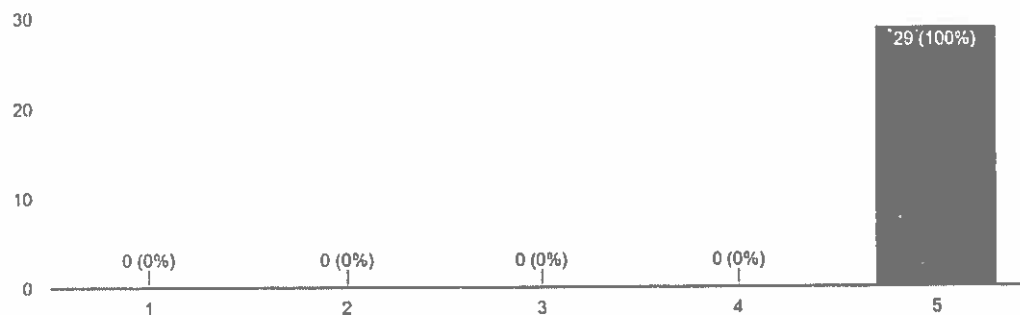

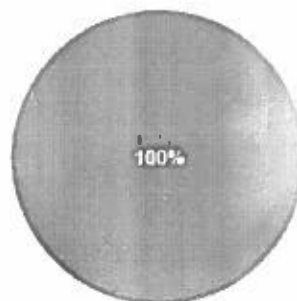

The researcher preferred questionnaire method and employed snow ball sampling to collect data. Analysis of data was done by using percentage of responses given. Hypotheses are tested with an appropriate statistical tool. The study concluded with suggestions/recommendations for creating more awareness event on **Awareness of Disha App**, Held on 28th June 2021 through virtual meeting

Summary of the event

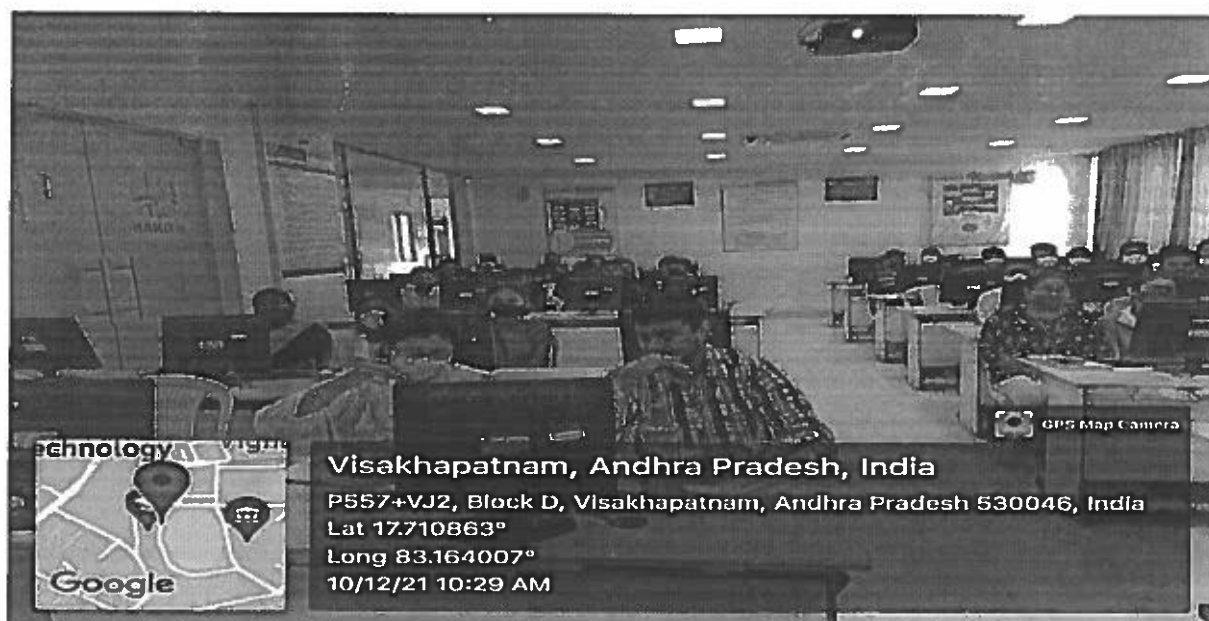

Green club**VENUE: SEMINAR HALL, DHARITHRI BLOCK****Abstract:**

Single-use plastics, or disposable plastics, are used only once before they are thrown away or recycled. These items are things like plastic bags, straws, coffee stirrers, soda and water bottles and most food packaging. We produce roughly 300 million tons of plastic each year and half of it is disposable! World-wide only 10-13% of plastic items are recycled. The nature of petroleum based disposable plastic makes it difficult to recycle and they have to add new virgin materials and chemicals to it to do so. Additionally there are a limited number of items that recycled plastic can be used. Petroleum based plastic is not biodegradable and usually goes into a landfill where it is buried or it gets into the water and finds its way into the ocean. Although plastic will not biodegrade (decompose into natural substance like soil,) it will degrade (break down) into tiny particles after many years. In the process of breaking down, it releases toxic chemicals (additives that were used to shape and harden the plastic) which make their way into our food and water supply. These toxic chemicals are now being found in our bloodstream and the latest research has found them to disrupt the Endocrine system which can cause cancer, infertility, birth defects, impaired immunity and many other ailments. We produce hundreds of millions of tons of plastic every year, most of which cannot be recycled. It's obvious that we need to use less plastic, move towards environmentally sustainable products and services and come up with technology that recycles plastic more efficiently.

Summary of the event:

Unlike metals, plastics do not rust or corrode. Most plastics do not biodegrade, but instead photo degrade, meaning that they slowly break down into small fragments known as micro plastics. The fragmentation of large plastic items into micro plastics is common on land such as beaches because of high UV irradiation and abrasion by waves, while the degradation process is much slower in the ocean due to cooler temperatures and reduced UV exposure. The assertions made in this document refer mostly to fossil-derived plastics and not to plastics of biogenic origins, although reference to the latter group is made in section. Single-use plastics, often also referred to as disposable plastics, are commonly used for plastic packaging and include items intended to be used only once before they are thrown away or recycled. These include, among other items, grocery bags, food packaging, bottles, straws, containers, cups and cutlery. The main polymers used to manufacture single use plastic items and indicate their most common applications.

Finally, students have come to know that Plastic is harmful to environment and burning of plastic in the open-air leads to environmental pollution due to the release of poisonous chemicals.

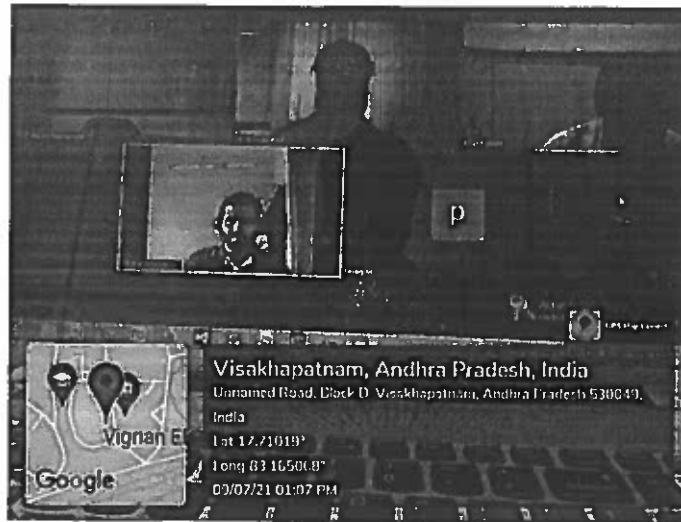
Summary of the Technical Seminar

However, the rate of adoption to those practices is very slow. lack of information as a result of insufficient education and reliable research on Green Buildings not only makes it difficult to acquire expert Green Buildings knowledge, but also decreases public awareness on Green Buildings. The high initial investment and limited financial resources and budget acts as a barrier to the adoption of green building. Green building costs higher compared to conventional buildings, which includes higher labor costs, costs related to installations that conform to design specifications like solar heating appliances, ground-source heat pumps etc., Despite the importance of incentives in encouraging Green Buildings adoption among stakeholders, they are lacking in many countries and that this 12 affects Green Buildings adoption. It is very important to create awareness in order to eradicate this barrier. Mandatory Green Buildings codes and regulations are lacking in India for Green Buildings adoption.

2. Minion planter made out of used tyres and plastic bottles

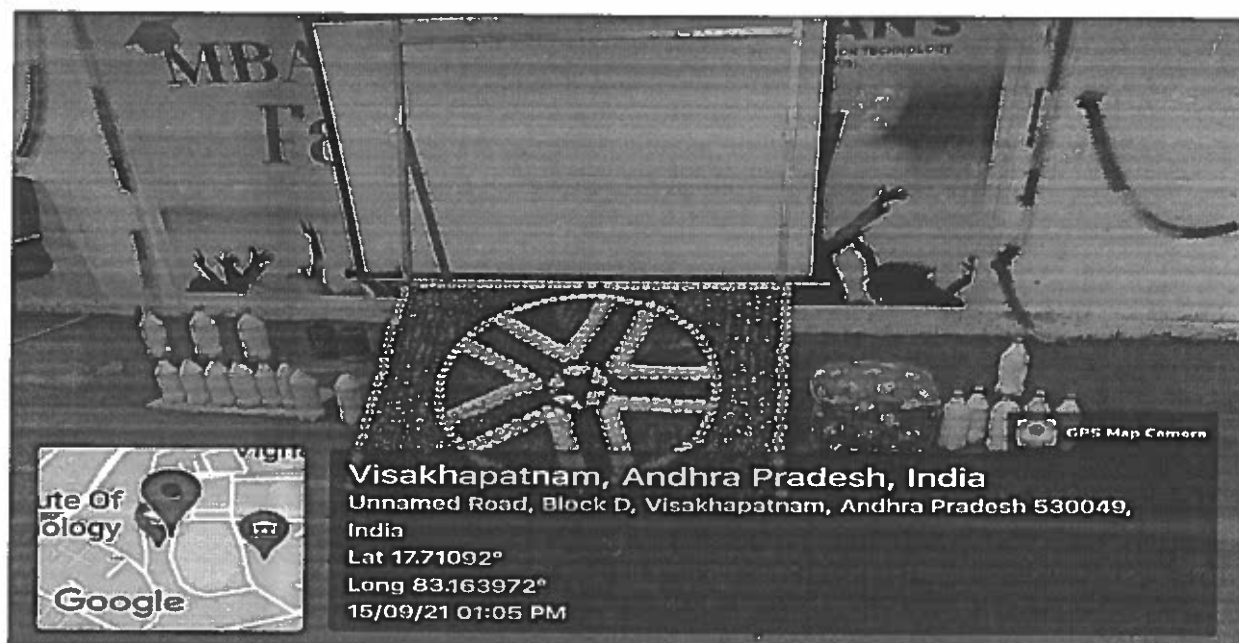
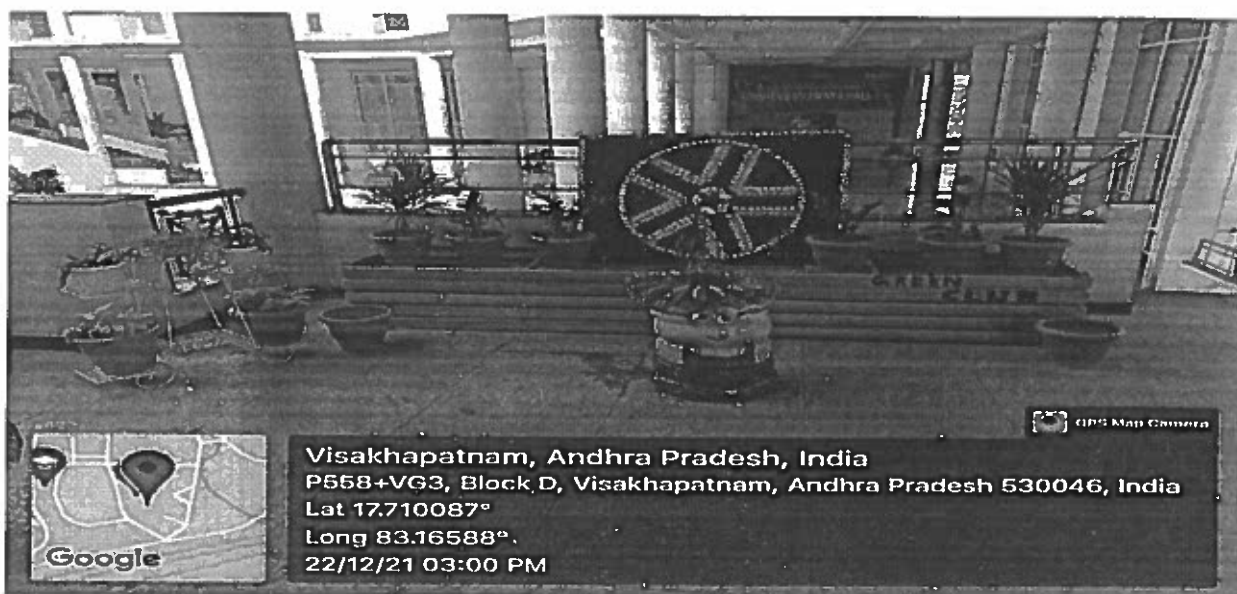
3. Snow man planter made out of used tyres and plastic bottles
4. Logo of our Institute made out of used plastic bottle and soda bottle caps.

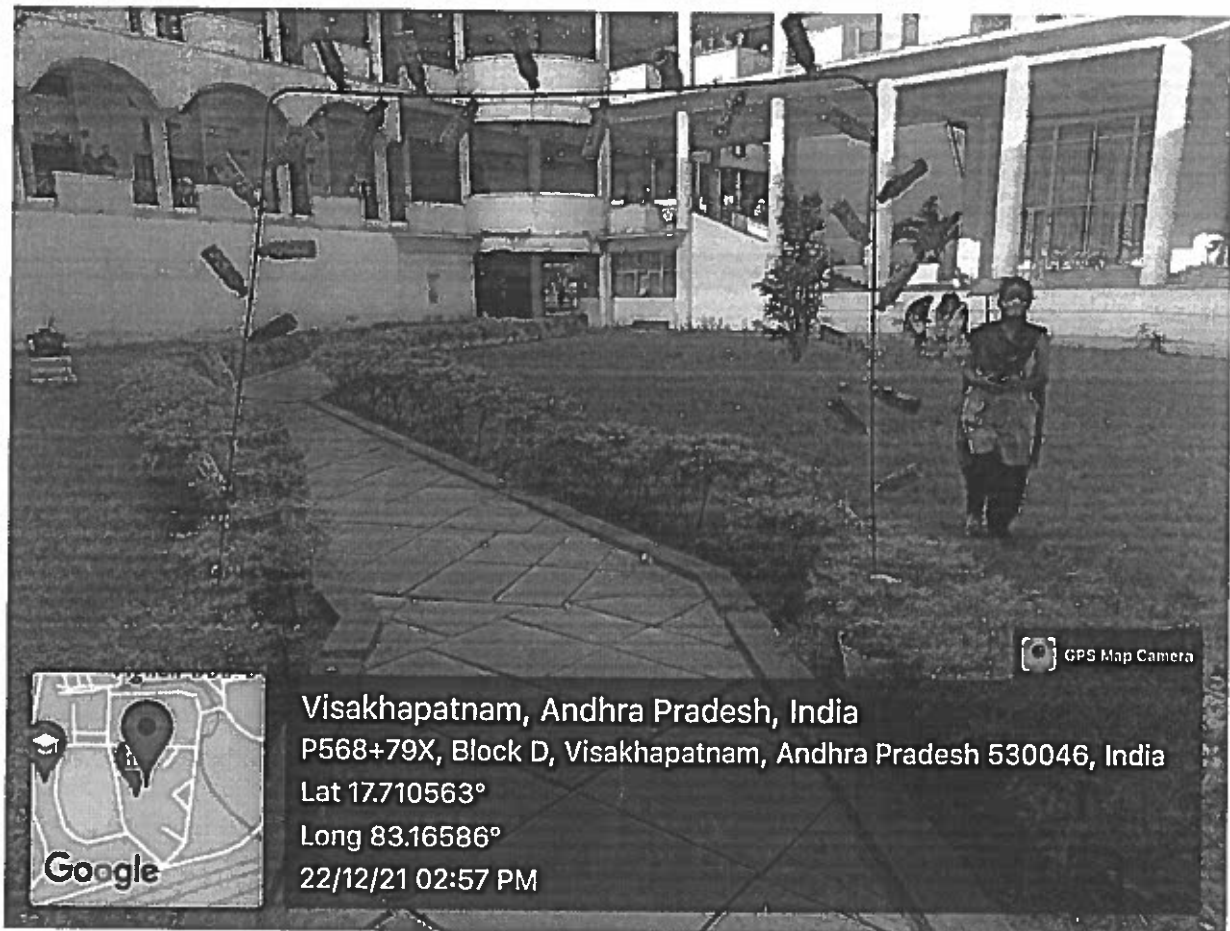
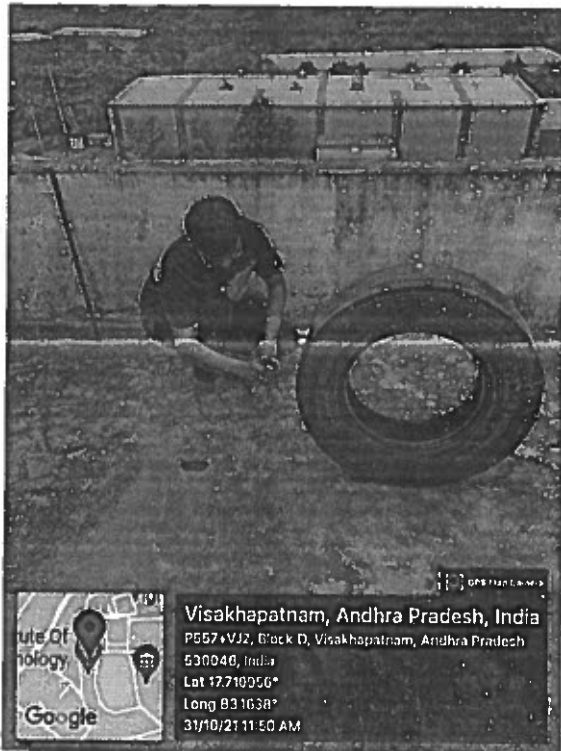
The workshop turned out to very lively with the active participation of the students from all years.

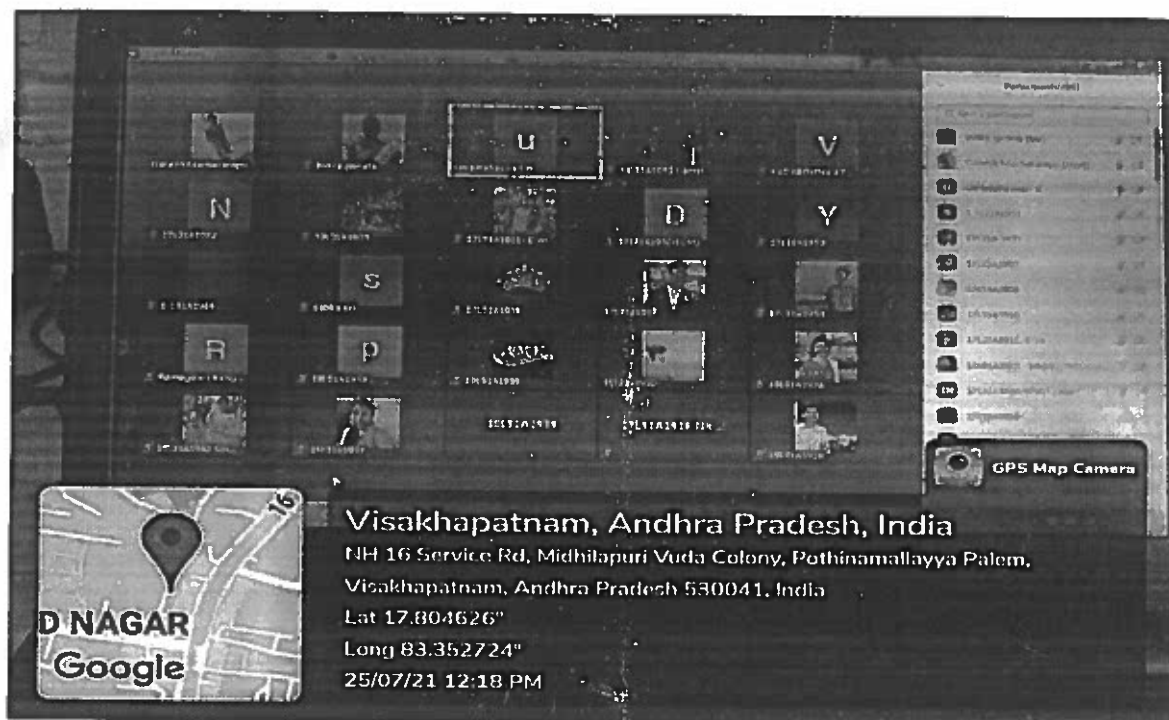

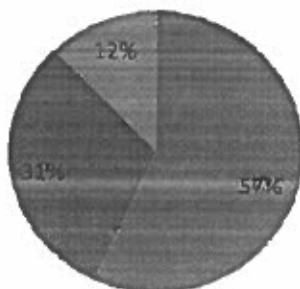

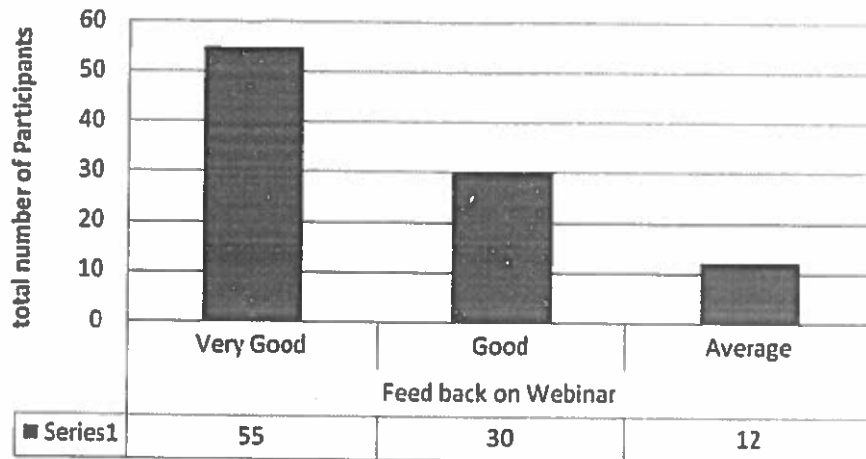
